Health Select Committee Chair Sarah Wollaston has left Leave campaign over untrue claims

Dr Sarah Wollaston, Chair of the Health Select Committee, [has left](#) the leave campaign – warning that there would be a “Brexit penalty” on the NHS if we leave, and attacking a leave campaign claim which “simply isn’t true”. Sarah Wollaston is right that the NHS relies on a strong economy. By sending Britain back into recession leaving Europe would put the health service we all rely on at risk.

The Leave campaign’s NHS claims are purposefully misleading. There would be no saving, only cost. The independent IFS has said leaving the EU’s single market would see the public finances hit by £40 billion, which would mean less money for the NHS, not more. The hit to our economy from leaving would hit our health service, along with British families, hard – making our country, and out services poorer. That’s a risk we can’t afford to take.

Sir John Major and Tony Blair will today warn that leaving Europe would "jeopardise the unity" of the UK in a speech as they campaign in Northern Ireland. They will show that a British government after a leave vote would face a choice between allowing a back-door route for illegal immigrants through Northern Ireland, or abandoning the Common Travel Area and imposing border controls. As two of the architects of the Northern Irish peace process, they will argue this hard border will not only disrupt the carefully constitutional balance in Northern Ireland, it will also damage it economically, as it will cause trade to fall.

In a speech today Sadiq Khan, the London mayor, will [say](#) Labour has a "monumental and historic responsibility" to make sure we remain in Europe. And will add that "we are here today because with just two weeks to go we want to send a crystal-clear message: it is Labour voters and supporters who will decide the outcome of this referendum". Shadow Home Secretary, Andy Burnham, has also called on people to vote to remain in Europe. He is [urging](#) voters not to treat the referendum as a protest vote, but to think long-term and to back remain. We are stronger, safer and better off in Europe.
